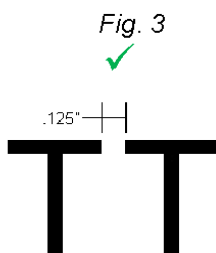
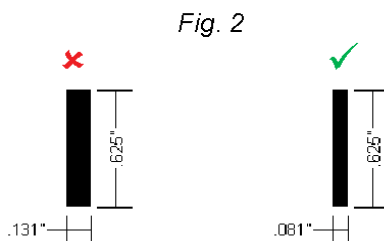
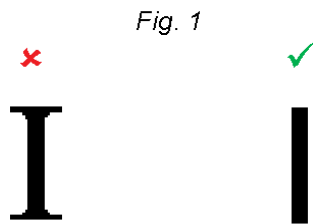

Revised Regulation

On September 15, 2010, the Department of Justice published revised and final ADA regulations. Enforcement of these new standards begins on March 15, 2012, for all new construction and alterations.

Changes & Interpretation

In anticipation of the 2012 enforcement of the revised ADA regulations, AOASigns has been making incremental changes to our production and design standards throughout 2011. Some of these changes are detailed below, along with AOASigns' interpretation of how the new regulations will influence your signage.



Style [703.2.3]

Sans Serif typestyles only. Simple serif typestyles (i.e. Times New Roman, Century Schoolbook, etc.) no longer comply. (Fig. 1)

Stroke Thickness [703.2.6]

The new guidelines for stroke thickness require thinner strokes. Most "Medium" typestyles (i.e. Helvetica Medium, Optima Medium, etc.) no longer comply. (Fig. 2)

Character Spacing [703.2.7]

A minimum of 1/8" space between adjoining characters is required. We have adjusted the settings in our graphic software to allow for 1/8" space between the "TT" letter combination. The spacing between other letter combinations will vary, depending on the typestyle used, but will not be less than 1/8". (Fig. 3)

Dimensions and Capitalization [703.3.1]

Indication of all caps copy in the Braille translation does not comply. AOASigns will continue our standard of not indicating capitalization in Braille. In order to comply with the new regulation for domed or rounded Braille, our Graphic Blast production process requires that the braille be painted the same color as the sign background. (Fig. 4)

Compliant Typestyles

Typestyles are limited. We have determined that the following fonts in our system are ADA compliant:

SansSerif	Helvetica Condensed
Arial	Helvetica Regular
Century Gothic	IKEA Sans Regular
Frutiger 55 Roman	Lucida Sans Unicode
FrutigerLTStd-Cn	MyriadPro-Regular

Where no typestyle is specified AOASigns' default font will be SansSerif.
